# ➤ Deadlines

The monitored withdrawal deadline is coming up in October!

After the Add/Drop period, if you don't want to continue with a course, you can request a Monitored Withdrawal. Withdrawing from a course means you are no longer enrolled and will not receive a grade at the end. The course remains on your transcript with a 'W' in place of the grade. Withdrawals do not affect your GPA. The deadline for monitored withdrawal for Fall 2023 is Friday, October 27.
