## Spotlight: Research

Getting involved in research can be a great way to delve into a topic of interest, as well as gain critical thinking and analytical skills. Fortunately, attending an [R1](#) institution means there's no shortage of research being conducted at the university.

However, learning about opportunities at Pitt is largely via word of mouth. Start inquiring within the school by visiting the office hours of faculty

doing research you're interested in, or by emailing them directly. Even if the work starts out at a very basic level, it can progress over time or be useful in leveraging for more advanced research. It's also possible to be cited in a publication as an undergrad, which isn't always the case at other universities.

Within SCI, there are several [labs](#) and institutions, as well as faculty conducting research using [grants](#) and other funding. To better structure and promote the research activities happening within the school, SCI recently created a new position, the [Associate Dean of Research](#). Dr. Walker has already started creating a directory of opportunities open to undergraduate students located [here](#).

Consider reaching out to non-SCI affiliated labs or entities, like ones within the School of Medicine or the School of Engineering. Check out the list the Office of Undergraduate Studies compiled [here](#). Consider how your technical interests might overlap with some of your other ones, such as sports, medicine, or the arts.

External opportunities, like summer research programs hosted at other institutions, or at REU sites funded by the [NSF](#), typically have more formal applications. Feel free to search for them online in directory based [sites](#) and through [Handshake](#). Many other universities have summer research opportunities, such as [MIT](#) and [Carnegie Mellon University](#), so be sure to check them out as well.

If you're still unsure about research, keep an eye out for research focused events, such as poster sessions held around campus and fairs like the [Undergraduate Research & Creative Expression Fair](#), which should have a spring date announced soon. You'll be able to learn more about various types of research, as well as speak to the individuals conducting it.

This is also a great topic to discuss with your advisor, especially if you're trying to earn [credit](#) for the experience.
