Spotlight: Other Experiential Learning

Although internships, hackathons, and research are some of the most popular ways to participate in experiential learning, they're not the only ones. There's also volunteer work, personal projects, student organization participation, student teaching and tutoring, business incubators, site visits, and more.

For volunteer work, be sure to fill out the SCI Community Engagement Volunteer [form](#) every fall and spring to be alerted of opportunities within the school or from our partners. Check out the [Office of PittServes](#) and their volunteer [portal](#) to look for other non-tech opportunities, as well as on sites, like [VolunteerMatch](#) and regional sites, like [Pittsburgh Cares](#).

If you're interested in becoming a teaching assistant (TA), tutor, or peer advisor, the opportunities tend to be housed in the program or academic unit they're associated with - for example, a Computer Science teaching assistant would work with the Computer Science department so you'd inquire with them. However, when it comes to peer tutors and peer advisors within SCI, please contact the Academic Advising or Student Success office to learn more. There's currently a posting for a peer advisor for the fall [here](#). Don't be afraid to look outside of SCI as well. There's typically opportunities available in the Math Assistance Center (MAC) and other departments on campus.

There's also no shortage of student organizations and clubs students can participate in at the university. There's several within SCI - the Computer

Science Club, Women in Computer Science, and MAC, to name a few, but there's also over 600 clubs across Pitt. Check out the directory [here](#).

For students looking to interact with employers, there's site visits that happen throughout the year, but also a larger program called '[Shadow in Your City](#)' that occurs at the end of the school year. Students can speak with employers in D.C., Philadelphia, and NYC either on-site or virtually. Be sure to check it out soon if you're interested, since slots fill up quickly!

Informational interviews can also be a great way to meet professionals and learn from them before graduating. Check out the 'Building Connections' portion of the SCI Career Services website [here](#) to learn more and to get started.
